Tulalip Police Department Issues Public Safety Warning on Potentially Contaminated Narcotics

Tulalip, WA – The Tulalip Police Department is issuing an urgent public safety warning following a series of suspected drug overdoses in the region. Chief Shawn Ledford has confirmed that there may be a dangerous batch of narcotics circulating in the area, possibly cocaine laced with an unknown substance.

In the past 24 hours, there have been five reported overdoses in Marysville near the 4th St Park and Ride. Chief Ledford urges the community to exercise extreme caution and avoid using any illicit substances. "The safety and well-being of our community members is our top priority," said Chief Ledford.
